Dear Honeywell Families and Staff

As we approach the end of a busy and fun-filled summer term, I am writing to enclose the **Governors' Annual Impact Statement** for 2025-26. **Thank you**, as ever, for each contribution that you make to Honeywell Schools: in the classrooms, dining hall and office; at events; in leading, teaching, fundraising, supporting and volunteering. Special thanks to Ms Arnold and Ms Clarke and their teams and to the PTFA chairs, Daisy and James, the trustees and reps.

For those of you in the Junior School, the term took an unexpected twist on the very last Monday when **Ofsted** called. We have been anticipating an inspection but could not have imagined the sense of déjà vu when the call came exactly 4 years to the date of their last inspection. We will not receive the official outcome until September, but we can say that it went well and we received positive feedback from the inspection team. Ms Clarke, Ms Thomson and Mr Ring worked with extraordinary energy and dedication during the two days together with all staff and children, who were the best possible voices for learning and enjoying life at Honeywell. Thank you to them all. Thank you also to more than 200 parents and carers who filled in the Ofsted survey. The results were fantastic and can be viewed online.

We have two governors stepping down who have served on the board for many years: Tim Carlton Jones as Pupil Welfare & Community Chair and Rebecca Horgan as Resources Chair. We thank them immensely for their time, commitment and contribution.

Tim, very recently, led a governor working group which has developed a new **Vision** statement for Honeywell Schools Federation:

We nurture every child within a caring community to achieve excellence, grow in confidence and character and feel a deep sense of belonging, responsibility and respect for others. We aspire for every child to grow – rooted in who they are – into a curious and capable learner, ready to branch out and flourish in a world of change, complexity and possibility.

The Vision reflects stakeholder views on what Honeywell Schools mean to them and what we aspire to for all Honeywell pupils. The Vision will form the foundation for future strategic priorities for both Schools. It will be launched officially through channels including the Website in the autumn.



Publication of KS2 (end of Year 6) SATS **results** was delayed until 16th July. We will not have final confirmation of the results until after the summer, but current draft shows levels in Maths, Reading and Writing that exceed last year's National and Wandsworth outcomes. The greater depth score for Reading looks set to be the highest for the last 4 years. Internal KS1 (end of Year 2) results (SATS no longer apply to Year 2) also show levels exceeding last year's National and Wandsworth.
